Trilogy premieres at Creek cinema

This café from David Burke Group has debuted at the second Silverspot Cinema, with more to come nationwide.

"We selected Coconut Creek to be the first Trilogy location as this was our first project under construction from the ground up," says Francisco Schlotterbeck, CEO of Naples-based Silverspot.

Movie-inspired cocktails (\$10), such as the Rye Seabiscuit julep, can be carried into the 11 screens.

"We wanted to develop an a la carte

concept conducive to guests joining us for a movie-going experience while also capturing guests who wish to have a special night out," says corporate chef Matt O'Neill.

New American signatures include tuna tartare wontons (\$13), grilled fish tacos (\$16), duck confit banh mi (\$16) and Angry Shrimp Fajitas (\$24). The BLT lobster roll (\$16) is also on the concession menu, which features gourmet desserts, such as peanut butter cup cake in a jar (\$6).

Lunch and dinner are served daily amid a sleek ambience with blond wood, plus an Art Deco-style patio beside a wind turbine that powers the exterior lights.
